

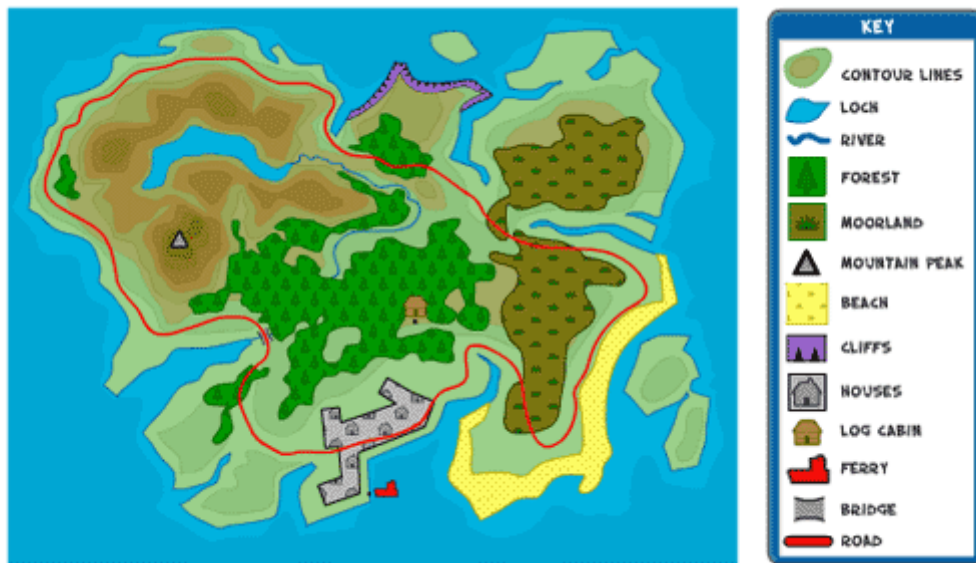
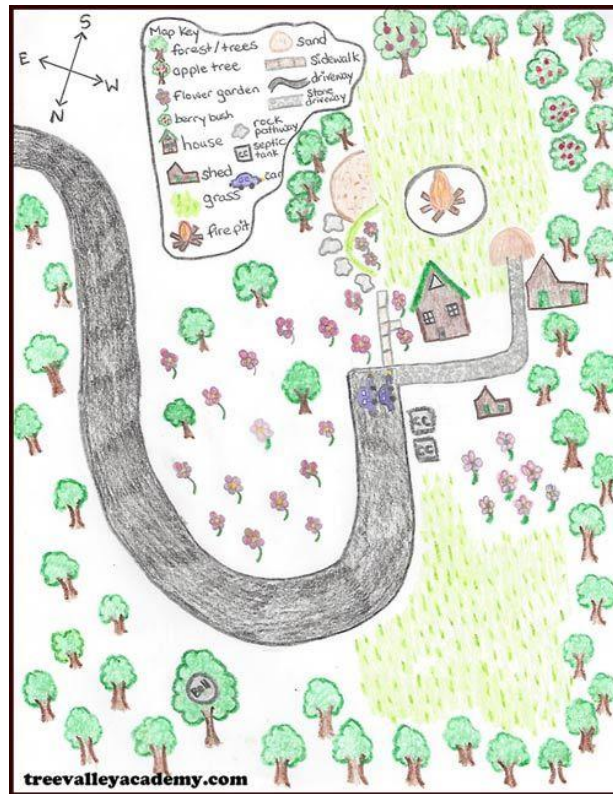

Geography Ideas – Map work

Can you draw a map - If your topic is Titanic can you draw to show it's route/ where it sunk? If you are learning about Cornish mining can you draw a map of Cornwall to show the sites? If your learning about the monarchy can you draw a map of the city where their palace/ home is? Can you draw a map of where you live? etc.

It is very important that anyone can understand your map. One way to do this is through using a key. A key means you don't have too much writing on your map; you use symbols/ colours/ pictures instead and write what they represent on the side - in the key.

- A title.
- Labels and annotations where needed.
- Simple lines.
- Enough detail to give a rough idea. Don't show every house and tree!
- A note to say that it is not to scale.
- A North arrow.
- A key to explain symbols.
